
The impact of pupil premium for last year

Key Stage Two

Our Pupil Premium money has been spent on staffing, resources, enrichment learning activities and professional development to impact on all groups of children.


The data below demonstrates the improvements in progress for pupils in KS2 who are eligible for FSM.

End of KS2 July	2012	2013
Eligible FSM pupils points progress in Reading from KS1 to KS2	10.0	14.4
Eligible FSM pupils Points progress in Writing from KS1 to KS2	11.7	16.0
Eligible FSM pupils Points progress in Maths from KS1 to KS2	12.3	14.0



Likewise, pupils making two levels progress across KS2 has also improved. There is a national expectation that children will make 2 levels of progress from the end of KS1 (end of year 2) to the end of Key Stage 2 (End of year 6).

Key Stage One

In KS1, pupils made some good progress through the use of 1:1 tuition and other interventions but their attainment still fell below national expectations in some cases. The school will ensure that continued pupil tracking and appropriate support is put in to help continue to close the gap for these pupils.

Across other year groups, children eligible for free School meals generally make good progress and in line with or above their peers.

Our Pupil premium allocation for 2012 -2013 was £33,155

Our allocation for 2013 -2014 is £60,300.

We already have plans in place to spend pupil premium in order to continue to close the gaps for eligible pupils.

Last year we spent some money on 1:1 tuition, or small group tuition or interventions for some pupils. This did accelerate progress and therefore we will continue to allocate money towards this.

We know that the FLO has worked considerably with a number of families. This has also included home visits for in year admissions to ensure that we build strong relationships between home and school. Feedback from parents who have been involved in programmes such as 'Helping My Child To Learn' has been positive. We are aware that the FLO must also become involved in early intervention for attendance issues where families might need support. This is on the school plan and is a priority for the school; therefore, we intend to continue to allocate pupil premium money on this role.

Achievement for All is tried and tested programme for raising attainment for pupils who need additional focus where there made be barriers to learning. Therefore we have allocated pupil premium funding to this and supply cover to facilitate the programme fully.

Both the School Business Manager and the Head teacher are attending training on the use of pupil premium to continue to develop our practice and ensure we are spending wisely.

Other CPD opportunities such as those for TAs, in particular we are sending our soon to be HLTAs on looking at accelerating progress in maths for KS1 and KS2 pupils. This will also focus on closing the gap in attainment and information will be disseminated to other staff.
