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The 'Statement of Principles' forms part of our Behaviour Management Policy.

The Governors of Dymchurch Primary School strongly believe that high standards of behaviour lie at the heart of a successful school that enables –

- all the pupils to make the best possible progress in all aspects of their school life and work and
- all staff to be able to teach and promote good learning without undue interruption or harassment.

We nurture the highest expectations of conduct, behaviour and manners throughout the school consistently, whether in the classroom, playground or the local community; ensuring that we promote and model excellent behaviour.

All members of the school community have the right to feel safe and happy at all times in school, during all activities. It is a primary aim of our school that there should be mutual respect between staff and pupils, between pupils, and that everyone feels equally valued.

All visitors to the school should feel safe and free from the effects of poor behaviour at all times and in all parts of the school.

The Behaviour Policy is therefore designed to:

- Promote an environment where everyone feels happy, safe and where excellent learning, academic, social and moral, is paramount.
- Ensure all children are treated fairly.
- Develop an environment which helps children to become positive, responsible and independent members of the school community.
- Develop a community where all members of the school can live and work together in a supportive and successful way.
